

School Chart

In the preamble, the chart of the International Francophone College in Sarajevo clearly reaffirms its educational values: educate children to be citizens, ecologically conscious citizens, responsible, aware of their rights and duties in a shared desire to learn, develop curiosity and creativity, respecting diversity, offering a window to the world, in accordance with secular values.

Respect the Chart and school regulations

Article 3

Respect the school building and material:

- · Take care and do not damage books, notebooks
- Take care and do not damage the equipment of the school and the school's premises
- · Put common equipment in order (in the classroom, gymnasium, in the corridors...)
- · Put your locker in order, your personal equipment

Article 5

- · Respect the school canteen:
- · Eat properly, behave yourself at the table
- · Do not waste food
- · Share the food that's left
- Notify the responsible adults of the place when you want to leave canteen (ask for permission)

Article 2a

· Respect each other

· Respect all children and all adults

· Understand and accept the others with all differences in character, skin colour, gender, language, culture, age...

· Be polite: Do not interrupt, ask to speak, listen...

· Show your respect by your posture (body language), your behaviour

· Use appropriate vocabulary, speak correctly

· Do not hurt (do not hit, do not insult)

· Take care than no child feels excluded

· Respect personal things, do not look at and do not touch other people's things without permission

· Help each other

Article 4

Respect the environment

- · Put the rubbish in the garbage bin
- · Save and do not waste paper, water, electricity, energy...

· Respect nature: Do not damage trees, plants

- · Do not smoke in the building
- · Dispose of cigarette butts in the ashtrays
- · Respect the rules of hygiene (do not spit on the floor, wash hands, do not touch unknown animals...)
